Mission

The Araya Foundation Thailand is dedicated to the charitable goal of helping to ensure that the learning needs of all young people are met through equitable access to appropriate learning and life skills programs as well as to serve the learning and working needs of youth particularly in rural, agrarian communities where the lack of formal and advanced education are most apparent.

Due to the personal biography of the founder of Araya Foundation, Dr. Duen Marti, the foundation has decided to focus its activities in Thailand. The Araya Foundation Thailand sets up and supports a program of volunteer teachers to encourage cultural exchange and facilitate foreign language learning by rural underprivileged Thai children. In our current world of globalization we believe foreign language skills, openness to foreign mentality and culture will be essential in ensuring peaceful and fruitful international cooperation and development.

We are currently working with multiple schools in Chiang Mai, Thailand, supplying them with volunteer English teachers in order to provide the students and teachers the opportunity of learning the English language from native speakers.

Founder Dr. Duen Marti who sees the importance of education and its necessity for the future of Thai children and who continues to advise and guide the foundation has appointed Mr. Metha Junhasiri as President and Mrs. Sumalya Suriya as Vice President as it is beneficial to have local leadership within the organization.

The Araya Foundation searches for qualified candidates who best personify the goals and values of the foundation. Since the founding of the Araya Foundation in 2010, a total of 32 volunteers have been provided to teach at 4 different Chiang Mai area schools.

In addition to education, the volunteers provide the children with their first real look at western culture, we believe that such positive interaction with foreigners at an early age can help broaden their worldview and leave a lasting impression.


Our volunteers are provided with on campus housing and all the basic necessities for living. We also prepare them with a loose curriculum for teaching that allows the volunteers to inject their own personalities and experiences into their lesson plans.

The Araya Foundation hopes that our program can make a real difference in the lives of these children.

Projects 2023

- 1. Volunteers Program: In May of 2023 we were able to bring in our first volunteer since the start of COVID.
- 2. Donation of funds to help hire a dormitory teacher at Giu Lae Luang School. [Since 2019]









We are happy to say that we have finally been able to restart the volunteer program.

Our first Volunteer since 2020 was James, from the U.S.

James came to us with a few years of professional teaching experience and was able to acclimate perfectly in a short time.

He was very enthusiastic and communicative, the children responded positively.

We could not have asked for a better restart to the program.





Past Projects

- **1. Volunteers:** Over the past Decade the Araya foundation has sponsored 32 volunteers from around the world to teach language skills at rural schools.
- **2. Agricultural:** The Araya Foundation has donated funds to help with several agricultural based projects such as Mushrooms Sheds at Baan Hua Khuang school (2016, 2019) and a vegetable garden at Giu Lae Luang School (2019).
- **3. Donations:** The Araya Foundation has donated sporting equipment and school supplies to are Baan Mai Pattana Santi School and Baan Mae Malaw Schools in Mae Chaem (2020), Mae Ngan Luang School in Mae Jaem (2019), Baan Pa Khao Lam School in Mae Taeng (2018), Rong Wua Daeng school in San Kham-phaeng (2017). In 2015, the Araya Foundation donated blankets for the young and elderly in the rural area of Mae Chaem.

We also donated for several projects to improve nutrition at Giu Lae Luang School between 2015-2020.

During the COVID pandemic The Araya Foundation donated masks, gel and rice multiple times to Giu Lae Luang, Baan Maelong, and Ban Huasom schools (2020-2023). We also donated meals to Maharaj and Hang Dong Hospitals (2021) and rice to the Chiang Mai Immigration Charity (2020)

4. Construction and Infrastructure: The Araya Foundation has renovated and old abandoned building at Giu Lae Luang School so it could be used as a dormitory (2013). This included the addition of toilets and shower facilities. Rooms for volunteers were added as well. Later (2014) a water tank and pump were added to the dormitory to aid with water flow and pressure. Recently in 2020 we remodeled and further improved this dormitory.

In 2013 the Araya Foundation has sponsored a Library as well as a Foreign Language Center (2016) at Baan Maelong School.

In 2010 the Araya Foundation built a two bedroom two bathroom teacher's dormitory at Namsum School.

We are so glad that we have recently been able to restart the volunteer program.

























From early 2020 to early 2023 we made donations to schools and local communities that were specific to the COVID pandemic.

Several times throughout this period the Araya Foundation Donated masks, Alcohol gel, and rice to Giu Lae Luang, Ban Huaysom, and Baan Maelong schools.

Another way the Araya Foundation found to help was by donating meals to the overworked hospital staffs at the area COVID hospitals. Mrs. Sumalya Suriya, Vice President of the Araya Foundation personally prepared these meals.

In April 2021 the Araya Foundation donated meals to the Cohort ward staff at Maharaj Hospital.

In May 2021 the Araya Foundation donated meals to the medical staff at Hang Dong Hospital.

May 2020 The Araya Foundation recently donated bags of rice, thru Chiang Mai Immigration's charity drive, to underprivileged families in Chiang Mai who are struggling due to COVID-19.



Donations: Meals to Schools








Over the years The Araya Foundation has, in cooperation with Chiang Mai Immigration's charity, made several donations to those in need in very rural areas.

Among the communities that the Araya Foundation has donated sporting equipment and school supplies to are Baan Mai Pattana Santi School and Baan Mae Malaw Schools in Mae Chaem (2020), Mae Ngan Luang School in Mae Jaem (2019), Baan Pa Khao Lam School in Mae Taeng (2018), Rong Wua Daeng school in San Kham-phaeng (2017).

In the winter of 2015, the Araya Foundation donated blankets for the young and elderly in the rural area of Mae Chaem.

We are currently looking for more community projects to help out with.


In 2010 the Araya Foundation built a two bedroom two bathroom teacher's dormitory at Namsum School.

Now that we have remodeled the children's dormitory, we are looking to refresh the volunteer rooms to make them more welcoming and comfortable.













Painting and Repair of Ceiling, Windows and Security bars

In 2020 thru 2021 The Araya Foundation sponsored a complete remodel of the children's dormitory at Giu Lae Luang School. This has massively improved the quality of life for the children who stay there during the school year.


High quality Industrial paints were used in hopes of keeping the dormitory looking good for years to come.

Ceiling tiles, windows and screens were replaced and security bars were added for the children's protection.









Wall Panels, Stairways, Flooring, Bathrooms and Plumbing

Wall panels in front of the bathrooms and dividing the boy's and girl's rooms were repaired or replaced and reenforced.

The stairway platform to the girl's dormitory was completely replaced and the broken wooden floor on the terrace was repaired and re-enforced.

The plumbing systems was completely reworked, replacing broken pipes and improving the drainage. Cesspits were added to bring the plumbing up to standard.





New Beds and Bedding

In February of 2021, with the first phase of the Renovation of the Dormitory at Giu Lae Luang School project having been completed. The Araya foundation purchased new bed frames as well as good quality mattresses.

The Araya Foundation donated 18 bunk beds and 44 mattresses. The foundation also secured a donation of an additional 4 bunk beds from Chan Furniture and the Chiang Mai Rotary Club. For the new bed frames, we decided to go with the best frames on the market which are made of stronger and thicker metal and should last for many years.

The total cost of the renovation project was 456,900 baht.
