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Introduction to Araya Foundation

The Araya Foundation is dedicated to the charitable goal of helping to ensure that the learning needs of all young people are met through equitable access to appropriate learning and life skills programs. We seek to identify a mode of education that would serve the learning and working needs of youth particularly in rural, agrarian communities where the lack of formal and advanced education are most apparent. Due to the personal biography of the founder of Araya Foundation, Dr. Duen Marti, the foundation has decided to focus its activities in Thailand.

We are currently working with 3 schools in Chiang Mai, Thailand, supplying them with volunteer English teachers in order to provide the students and teachers the opportunity of learning the English language from native speakers.

In 2015, the Araya Foundation seeing the benefit of learning the Chinese Language started a pilot program at one of our partner schools providing native Chinese language speakers to teach the children.

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Araya Foundation Overview



Araya Foundation Thailand is a non-profit organization founded May 2010 in Chiang Mai for the purpose of promoting education of children in rural areas.

There are three board members and one field officer under the President, Ms. Sumalya Suriya and Vice President / Founder Dr. Duen Marti who sees the importance of education and its necessity for the future of Thai children.

The Araya Foundation searches for qualified candidates who best personify the goals and values of the foundation. Since the founding of the Araya Foundation in 2010, a total of 27 volunteers have been provided to teach at 4 different Chiang Mai area schools.

In addition to education, the volunteers provide the children with their first real look at western culture, we believe that such positive interaction with foreigners at an early age can help broaden their worldview and leave a lasting impression.

Our volunteers are provided with on campus housing and all the basic necessities for living. We also prepare them with a loose curriculum for teaching that allows the volunteers to inject their own personalities and experiences into their lesson plans.

The Araya Foundation hopes that our program can make a real difference in the lives of these children.

Projects for 2016

(1) Providing English speaking volunteers to teach English at rural schools

The Araya Foundation has provided native English speaking volunteers to teach English to students in rural areas. At present, there have been four schools who have participated in this program;

2. Baan Hua Khuang School, A. Doi Lor, Chiang Mai, Thailand
3. Baan Maelong School, A. Hod, Chiang Mai, Thailand
4. Namsum School, A. Hang Dong, Chiang Mai, Thailand

There have been a total of 27 volunteers who have worked with the Araya Foundation. All have made a big impact and have left us better than they found us.

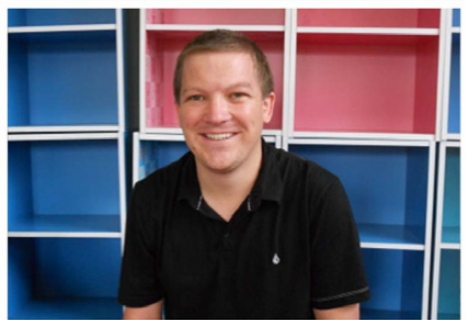

Projects for 2016 (Cont'd)

(2) Providing Chinese speaking volunteers to teach Chinese at rural schools

Starting in 2015, the Araya Foundation has added a Chinese Language Pilot Program at Baan Maelong School in Hod. China is an important regional neighbor and tourism from China has been on a sharp rise over the past few years increasing the value of learning the Chinese Language.

So far the children at Baan Maelong have enjoyed their Chinese lessons and the program looks to be a great success.

Projects for 2016 (Cont'd)

(3) Donation of funds to build Foreign Language Center at Baan Maelong School



The Araya Foundation has funded Baan Maelong School's proposal for 150,000 baht to turn the unused space under the 5th and 6th grade classroom annex into a Foreign Language Center in order to provide good and adequate facilities for the learning and teaching of foreign languages. The projected is estimated to be completed by the end of November 2016.

Projects for 2016 (Cont'd)

(4) Donation of funds to support Agriculture Project for Sustainability – Mushroom Shed at Baan Hua Khuang School



The Araya Foundation has provided Baan Hua Khuang School funding to improve the existing growing shed and to purchase mushroom starter kits for their project. With this project the school is hoping to help students learn to be self-sufficient and develop skills for the future as well as creating a good relationship between school, parents, community and the Foundation. All crops harvested will be used for school lunches.

Projects for 2016 (Cont'd)



(5) Donation of funds to hire a dormitory teacher at Giu Lae Luang School

In early 2014, Giu Lae Luang School was subjected to severe budget cuts and needed to hire a new teacher for the children living at the dorm, at their own expense. Previously, teachers at the schools had to take turns supervising the dorm children after school hours. The Araya Foundation has stepped in to help cover some of the monthly costs of hiring this new teacher. She has had an excellent impact on the children who live at the dorm and provides them with a more stable environment.



(6) Donation of eggs and special meals to enhance nutrition for dormitory students at Giu Lae Luang School

In order to enhance the nutritional value of the children's meals at Giu Lae Luang School, the Araya Foundation has been overseeing a special meal for the children who live at the dorms. Twice a month a meal is chosen from the children's favorites and enhanced with fruit and vegetables. The Araya foundation also donates eggs on a bi-weekly bases to help endure that the children are receiving enough protein with all meals. With thanks to friend of the foundation, Joy Wang, whose donation made this all possible.



Projects for 2016 (Cont'd)



(7) Donation of funds to provide meals for kindergarteners at Giu Lae Luang School

Schools are not provided a meal stipend for kindergarten boarding students by the government. Because of this, the Araya Foundation with the help of Joy Wang, has set-up funding of lunches for children who fall in to that criteria to help alleviate the financial burden of the schools.



(8) Developing and maintaining Foundation Volunteer Recruitment Website and Facebook Page

The Araya Foundation is creating a Volunteer Recruitment Website and maintaining a Facebook Page to inform potential volunteers and keep interested parties up to date with current information regarding the foundation and to be used for the volunteers to share their knowledge and experiences.

Past Projects

(1) Renovation and construction of student dormitory and volunteer rooms at Giu Lae Luang School



Araya Foundation has carried out the wishes of Giu Lae Luang School by renovating an abandoned building on campus and turning it into a student dormitory for students who live far from the campus.

The structure of the existing building, made from wood and concrete, was still strong but had fallen into disrepair due to a lack of maintenance. The Foundation has re-enforced the flooring, replaced the ceiling and roof, painted the building, added mosquito screens, ceiling fans, bedding and furniture. A new stairway was added, leading to the second storey on the boy's side. Also added was a newly constructed shower area / bathroom with 14 rooms, 7 on the girl's side and 7 on the boy's. A washing area was also built at the rear of the building.



In addition to the improvement of the student dormitory, the Araya Foundation also built rooms for volunteers who teach English to the students at the school. Two rooms with bathrooms were created at the first floor of the student dormitory.

Summary of Construction and Renovation Costs

1. Construction and Renovation 760,149.46 baht.
 2. Furniture and Bedding for Student Dormitory 168,700 baht.
 3. Furniture, Bedding and Electrical Appliances for Volunteer Rooms 87,034 baht
- Totaling 1,015,883.46 baht

Past Projects (Cont'd)

(2) Donation of funds to build library at Baan Maelong School



The Araya Foundation has donated 300,000 baht to build a library at Baan Maelong School, A. Hod, Chiang Mai. The library was completed and named "CJ Huang Library" The building is divided into 2 parts (1) the library itself, which has a collection of books and instructional media for student education and (2) a computer room, to serve as a source of training in the use of computer technology.

(3) Donation of supplies for volunteer housing at Baan Maelong School



The Araya Foundation has donated the following items for the volunteer housing : wardrobe closet, mattresses, bedding, wall fan, hot water heater and necessary appliances such as toaster oven, hot plate, rice cooker, electric kettle etc. For a total cost of 21,236 baht.

(4) Construction of teacher's dormitory at Namsum School



In 2010, The Araya Foundation built a fully furnished 2 bedroom, 2 bathroom teacher's dormitory with a shared kitchen area on the grounds of the Namsum School in Hang Dong District of Chiang Mai, in order to accommodate volunteers and visiting teachers.

Past Projects (Cont'd)

(5) Donation of water pump and tank to dormitory at Giu Lae Luang School to help with water shortages

Giu Lae Luang is located in a small village that has had many disruptions to their water supplies. This is an especially big problem when you have dozens of children using the shower at the same time. The Araya Foundation has added a large water tank and pump to the school dorm to help alleviate water shortages.



(6) Donation of rice, books and bookshelves to Giu Lae Luang School, Baan Hua Khuang School and Baan Maelong School



On January 14, 2014 Araya Foundation Founder, Dr. Duen Marti along with a group of generous donors from Switzerland, donated rice to help supplement the schools lunch programs. English books were also donated to enhance their libraries. Additionally, bookshelves were provided to Baan Maelong School to help complete their new library.

(7) Donation of sporting equipment to Giu Lae Luang School and Baan Hua Khuang School

(8) Donation of weekly food delivery to enhance nutrition for dormitory students at Giu Lae

In 2015 the Araya Foundation began a weekly program to deliver extra food to Giu Lae Luang School to help enhance the nutritional value of the dorm children's meals. This donation comes courtesy of Ms. Joy Wang, a friend of the foundation.

(9) Donation of sporting equipment to Chiang Mai Immigration for children in rural area of Mae Chaem

During the school year the Araya Foundation helped Chiang Mai Immigration's own charity by donating sporting equipment to be used by rural schools in Mae Chaem, Chiang Mai.



(10) Donation of team shirts to Chiang Mai Immigration for "Bike for Mom" event

On Mother's day the Araya Foundation sponsored the Chiang Mai immigration team by donating special 'Bike for Mom' shirts to wear at the event held in honor of her majesty Queen Sirikit.



(11) Donation of blankets to Chiang Mai Immigration for children and elderly in rural area of Mae Chaem

This winter the Araya Foundation donated blankets for the young and elderly in the rural area of Mae Chaem by way of Chiang Mai Immigration's own charity.
